So, you know how much money you need, how much you have, and now you need a plan to make up any difference. Let's look at all the options that may be available to help you cover the shortfall.

IF YOU NEED TO ACCESS A GOVERNMENT STUDENT LOAN

When it comes to paying for college, government student loans have several advantages over private student loans including:

- Interest free status your loans do not accrue interest while you are a full-time student.
- Repayment Assistance Program If required, your monthly student loan payments can be reduced or suspended, depending on your financial situation.
- Grant eligibility as part of your student loan application, you are automatically considered for various grants.

THE FIRST STEP TO ACCESS A STUDENT LOAN IS TO DETERMINE YOUR PROVINCE OF RESIDENCE

You will need to apply for funding through your province or territory of residence. Your province of residence is defined as the last province you have lived in for one full year without being a full-time student.

IF ALBERTA IS YOUR PROVINCE OF RESIDENCE

The governments of Alberta and Canada provide student loans and grants to help you reach your post-secondary educational goals.

When you apply as a full-time student, you are considered for both Provincial and Federal student loans and grants. Financial assistance is also available for students studying part-time. Certificate, Diploma, Undergraduate and Graduate students can receive up to \$7,500 per semester in combined Alberta and Canada student loans. Additional funds may be available in the form of grants.

Part-time loan students could receive up to \$10,000 per academic year in Canada Student Loans. For more information and to access resources, visit **studentaid.alberta.ca**.

PRIVATE STUDENT I DANS

If you are not eligible for government student loans, banks and financial institutions offer private student loan options. Contact your bank or financial institution to learn more about programs they have available for students.



YOU ARE TAKING AN APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

Registered Apprentices in Alberta can access the following funding options to support their training:

Student Aid Alberta Funding – If you are a resident of Alberta, you can apply for loans and grants through Student Aid Alberta. For more information about student loans and grants, go to studentaid.alberta.ca.

Scholarships are offered by the Government of Alberta that are only available to apprentices. Visit **tradesecrets.gov.ab.ca** for more information.

The Government of Canada provides loans and grant options for students in Apprenticeship Programs.

The Government of Canada programs include:

- Canada Apprentice Loan you can apply for up to \$4,000 in an interest-free loan per period of technical training. The money will be available to you to help pay for tuition, tools, equipment and living expenses. For more information visit the Government of Canada website at canada.ca/apprentice.
- Apprenticeship Incentive Grant (AIG) a taxable cash grant of \$1,000 per year/level up to a maximum of \$2,000. This grant helps registered apprentices in designated Red Seal trades get started. For more information on this grant visit canada.ca/apprentice.
- Apprenticeship Completion Grant (ACG) a taxable cash grant of \$2,000. This grant helps registered apprentices, who have completed their training, become certified journeypersons in designated Red Seal trades. For more information on this grant visit canada.ca/apprentice.

ROOM O' PLENTY

STUDENT AWARDS YOU MIGHT BE ELIGIBLE FOR AN AWARD

In addition to government loans and grants you may be eligible for an award that can help you pay for your education. GPRC's Student Awards program provides financial support to students entering or continuing a program at GPRC. Awards are granted to students in recognition of academic achievement, financial need, leadership, and community involvement.

Scholarships primarily recognize and reward academic excellence, although extracurricular activities, community involvement, and financial need may also be considered.

Bursaries are primarily awarded based on financial need, although academic excellence, extracurricular activities, and community involvement may all be considered.

GPRC's Student Award program disburses approximately \$450,000 annually in scholarships and awards.

BE PREPARED

When applying for awards, scholarships, and bursaries prepare a portfolio that includes:

- A listing of extra-curricular and community involvement
- Your education and career goals
- Your academic records (transcripts, statement of grades, test scores)
- Your personal accomplishments (certificates of recognition, participation awards)
- Letters of reference that speak to community involvement and extra-curricular activities.

Give yourself enough time to meet all the scholarship or bursary requirements. Submit your application and all documentation on time.



If you have enough resources to cover the cost of your education, you can pay your tuition and fees directly to Student Services. If you have any questions about paying your tuition and fees, please contact our office at 780.539.2981.

If you are registered for courses, you can view your fees on your myGPRC account. GPRC offers many options for you to pay your student fees.

ONLINE/TELEPHONE BANKING

Each bank has a specific process tailored to their website or telephone banking system. Payments are accepted online or by telephone banking. It's just like paying any other bill.

Search and select Grande Prairie Regional College (don't forget the "e" in Grande) in your pay bills menu.

When you are asked to enter your account number, use your student ID number.

Your student ID can be found on your student schedule, and your student ID card.

To Make a Payment, visit plastiq.com

- ► Add Grande Prairie Regional College as a payee on your account. You can also search for us by clicking on New Payee at the top of the screen. Enter Grande Prairie Regional College and select us from the menu.
- ► Click on the **pay now** button and enter all required information. Note: your GPRC Student ID number is necessary to ensure the payment is applied to your account. Please ensure it is entered correctly.

Once submitted, you will receive an email confirming your payment.
