Application Deadline: March 31, 2021

The Exelon Research Award for Women in STEM is a \$3,000 USD award reserved for an exceptional student research proposal submitted by a female-identifying student who is currently enrolled in a STEM program. Eligible programs include the following:

- Bachelor of Science (University Transfer)
- Computing Science, Computing & Information Systems, or Computer Systems Technology
- Parts and Materials Technician
- Power Engineering
- Motorcycle Mechanic

- Electrician
- Industrial Mechanic
- Automotive Service Technician
- Carpenter
- Heavy Equipment Technician
- Gasfitter, Plumber, Steamfitter-Pipefitter
- Welder

Guidelines and Requirements

- Full- or part-time female-identifying GPRC students who are currently enrolled in an eligible credit program are encouraged to apply.
- Proposals must address a research problem relevant to one or more STEM fields (as defined above).
- The outcome of the project should help address a specific need or problem faced by industry, community, or the scientific community.
- The proposal must have clear objectives, a preliminary budget justification, timelines, and proposed deliverables.
- The project should be manageable to implement in a four-month time frame (extensions may be granted in certain circumstances).

Adjudication Criteria:

All adjudications are final and confidential. No appeals will be considered. Applications will be reviewed by a multidisciplinary committee and ranked according to the following selection criteria:

CRITERIA	Indicators	Weight
Project Potential	Is the project idea original and meritorious? Does it have potential to advance knowledge? Is the methodology appropriate and effective?	40%
Applicability	Does the project respond to a real industry or community need? Will the project outcomes have utility in the "real world?"	30%
Feasibility	Can the project be completed in the suggested time frame with the available resources? Is the project scope meaningful and achievable?	
Presentation	Is the proposal relatively free of spelling, grammatical, and mechanical errors? Has the applicant adhered to formatting guidelines and used an appropriate and consistent citation style?	10%

Student Project Proposal (1,500 words MAXIMUM)

Your proposal will be reviewed by a multidisciplinary committee; please avoid the use of abbreviations and jargon. Define technical terms as necessary.

A comprehensive reference list/bibliography is encouraged but not required.

On a separate sheet, please provide a detailed description of your proposed project. Please use the following category headings (in bold) to format your proposal:

- Project Title: Please be descriptive in your title.
- **Project Background and Rationale (max. 200 words):** Please describe the context/background as well as the rationale behind your research/project (i.e., why is this research necessary?).
- Project objectives or research question(s) (max. 200 words): Please describe your research question(s), objectives, or hypotheses.
- **Proposed methodology (max. 400 words):** Please describe the methodology and outline its appropriateness for addressing your research question(s).
- Merit/impact of the project (max. 200 words): Please describe the implications, benefits and outcomes of your research/project, and how it advances your field of interest.
- **Timelines:** Please include an activity schedule that includes key milestones and expected completion dates for each phase of the research. Make sure your timeline is detailed and realistic.
- **Budget:** If there are any budget requirements for the completion of this research (e.g.: purchased materials, rental of facilities or equipment, etc.), please list all costs. (Please note that all budget requests are subject to approval by the selection committee.)
- Sharing your results (150 words): Please communicate how you intend to share the result of your research (presentation, written report, publication, performance, display). Consider how you will manage COVID-19 related health and safety measures.
