COURSE OBECTIVES:

During this course, the student will:

- 1. Perceive visual relationships in the environment and record these perceptions in terms of the elements of art (line, shape, value and texture)
- 2. Identify and apply the principles of aesthetic unity (balance, rhythm, repetition, dominance and contrast/variety) to the organization of the elements of visual art .
- 3. Manipulate the elements of visual art on a two-dimensional surface through using the principles of

depth perception.

4. Exhibit a basic working knowledge of the fundamental techniques and materials of drawing including the use of pencil, ink, conte and charcoal.

LEARNING OUTCOMES: By the end of this course, students will:

- 1. Possess a basic working knowledge of the fundamental techniques and materials of drawing materials: pencil, ink, brush, ink wash, conte and charcoal.
- 2. Become acquainted with the basics of composition as related to drawing.
- 3. Become acquainted with the elements of visual art used on a two-dimensional surface to create a sense of depth: One-point perspective, atmospheric space and chiaroscuro.
