COURSE OBJECTIVES:

During this course the student will:

1. Perceive visual relationships in the environment and record these perceptions in terms of the elements of art (line, shape, value and texture)
2. Identify and apply the principles of aesthetic unity (balance, rhythm, repetition, dominance and contrast/variety) to the organization of the elements of visual art .
3. Manipulate the elements of visual art on a two-dimensional surface through using the principles of depth perception.
4. Exhibit a basic working knowledge of the fundamental techniques and materials of drawing including the use of pencil, ink, conte and charcoal.
5. Possess introductory knowledge related to drawing the figure in monochromatic media.

LEARNING OUTCOMES: At the conclusion of this course the student will:

1. Possess a basic working knowledge of the fundamental techniques and materials of drawing materials: pencil, ink, brush, ink wash, conte and charcoal.
2. Learn how to execute a portrait in monochromatic media.
3. Develop the basic skills to render and record the human form.
4. Learn the basics of composition as related to drawing.

COURSE SCHEDULE/TENTATIVE TIMELINE:
