CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:

AR2430 Drawing is a continuation of the introductory level studio AR2410. It is designed to continue the development of basic perceptual and recording skills primarily through the use of monochromatic media. The course will expand on the basic principles and techniques of drawing. This is a studio-based course involving mainly still life, the human figure and landscape.

GRADING CRITERIA:

Sketchbook Assignment	15 %	(7.5% per term, not averaged)	
Process	25%	Process grades includes any day to day activities, these marks are weight to an appropriate amount If you are absent, there is no opportunity to make up a missed process grade. This portion weight may be adjusted up or down based on the number of activities.	
Attendance/ Participation	10%	This is a straight forward mathematical formula based on attendance which to a degree it also reflects participation.	

Attendance is mandatory. (Department Guidelines)

More than 20% absenteeism may constitute a failure except for medical or extenuating circumstances in which case a doctor's letter may be required.

Students will receive a warning 'Notice Of Absenteeism' at 15% absenteeism.

After 20% absenteeism, you may be required to withdraw from the course.

You are required to sign the attendance sheet immediately upon your arrival.

EVALUATIONS:

Learning Ourcomes of AR2430

- 1. Perceive visual relationships in the environment and apply these perceptions in terms of the elements of art (line, shape, value, space and texture)
- 2. Further manipulate the elements of visual art on a two-dimensional surface through using the principles of depth perception.
- 3. Further identify and apply the principles of aesthetic unity (balance, rhythm, repetition, dominance and contrast/variety)
- 4. Exhibit an expanded working knowledge of the fundamental techniques and materials of drawing including the use of pencil, conté, pastels, graphite, ink and charcoal and apply technical knowledge to drawings of: portraits, figure, gesture and tonal and line drawings.
- 5. Start to exhibit critical thinking through analysis, discussions and critiques.
- 6. Develop an aesthetic appreciation for the art of drawing.

Course Objectives of AR2430, Students will:

- 1. Acquire perceptual drawing skills.
- 2. Develop an understanding of the basic elements of drawing: line shape, value and texture and colour.
- 3. Develop an understanding and apply the concepts of unity and composition.
- 4. Develop an aesthetic appreciation of drawing.
- 5. Develop specific and techniques through a variety of media.
- 6. Acquire the confidence to apply these techniques to artistic expressions and ideas.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Bring the required supplies for every class. If you have missed a previous class it is your responsibility to ask your fellow students or the instructor before the start of class to insure that you have the appropriate supplies and materials ready.
- **Be punctual!** If you arrive late you will have to ask your classmates for the information. You are fully responsible for the material covered in class, projects and due dates. I will not be delivering one to one classes or lectures.

Over View

Topical Areas - Still Life, Portrait, Figure, Experimental Drawing Approaches/Concepts using a wide range of materials and techniques. Assignments will have specific criteria.

- Line
- Accenting, linear weighting
- Balance, Positive and negative space
- Texture and pattern
- Tonal Development Pictorial Space, Overlapping/Depth, Modeling of a form
- Further attention to arrangement of the composition
- Sensitivity to various media
- Hand / eye recording and measuring skills
- Perspective hand drawn
- Construction Drawing and Measurement

Content may not be covered in the sequence as listed below.

The instructor will determine assignments. Projects will be assigned for homework and handed in on the expected on the due date. Failure to finish projects on time for class critiques will affect student's final evaluation.
