COURSE OBJECTIVES:

1. Expand the basic principles of two-dimensional design: line, shape, value, texture, color, tone and composition.

2. Manipulate the elements of visual art on a two-dimensional surface through the application of depth perception (overlapping, mechanical perspective, diminishing size and detail, tonal modeling).

3. Perceive visual relationships in the environment and record these perceptions in terms of the elements of the visual arts.

4. Exhibit the basic working skills used in advanced techniques and materials of drawing including the use of pencil, charcoal, pastels, colored pencils and collage.

5. Further development of the skills to render and record the human form.

6. The ability to use various drawing mediums to articulate and illustrate ideas and themes that are conceptual in nature.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

1. Possess advanced skills with the techniques and materials of drawing: pencil, ink, brush, pastel, conte, mixed media and charcoal.

- 2. Develop the basic skills to render and record the human form.
- 3. Have advanced comprehension of composition as related to drawing.

4. Demonstrate skills in the visual language of drawing through working with series and abstraction.

5. Will be able to use drawing as a conceptual and expressive tool.

- 3. Portfolio presentations will be required throughout the duration of this course.
- 4. Participation grade is established by your level of enthusiasm, commitment, involvement and flexibility in both studio and individual/collective critiques. It is also determined by your attending of all classes.

Mid-Term Grading:

Mid-term grading is by portfolio. It constitutes **45%** of the final grade. The portfolio will contain all of the in-class and extension assignments from the first half of the term. Overdue portfolios will be penalized a minimum of 1 grade point per late day.

End-Term Grading:

End-term grading is by portfolio. It constitutes **40%** of the final grade. The portfolio will contain all of the in-class and extension assignments from the second half of the term. Overdue portfolios will be penalized a minimum of 1 grade point per late day.

5% of the final grade will be determined by attending and recording all of the Fine Arts/ Visual Arts/ Visitor in the Arts program. At this point it will be virtual presentations10% of the final grade will be determined by Participation

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

Additional Visual Arts Student responsibilities RE: Art Studio A and B

- 1. Masks: masks must be worn continually throughout the class when 2-metre distancing cannot be maintained.
- Hand sanitizing: Everyone must sanitize their hands upon entering and exiting each class. As well, wash and sanitize hands before and after use of equipment; before and after breaks, before and after touching personal belongings; before and after using shared items (paper cutter, rulers, scissors, etc).
