REQUIRED TEXT/RESOURCE MATERIALS: There is no text for this course. The students will be responsible for printing articles off of Moodle.

CALENDAR DESCRIPTION: This course is designed to help students understand children's behaviour and what it means to use a positive guidance approach in supporting children's social, emotional, and moral development. Environmental and developmental factors which influence behaviour are examined, as are the principles of the guidance approach and ways in which these principles can be applied in early learning and child care settings.

CREDIT/CONTACT HOURS: 2 credits (30 hours)

DELIVERY MODE(S): Classroom instruction will be a combination of lecture and small and large group work. Audio-visual material and additional resources will supplement reading package.

OBJECTIVES: Upon successful completion of this course, the student should be able to:

Explain how guidance, discipline, and punishment differ in goals and in practice.

Discuss legislative policies and ethical practices relevant to guiding children's behavior.

Explain how development influences behavior.

☐ Identify environmental factors that can influence children's behavior.

Outline strategies practitioners canuse to create positive interpersonal environments.

☐ Identify positive and respectful communication practices and attitudes in guiding children's behavior.

Discuss developmentally appropriate, positive prevention strategies when guiding children's behavior
