Course Description:

Infant Toddler Care examines the characteristics of quality programs for infants and toddlers and explores programming techniques which respond to individual and group needs of children up to 36 months of age. The focus of this course is on developing an awareness of the critical importance of care and interaction in infants' and toddlers' lives.

Class Format: Class Time will be comprised of lectures, discussion, A.V. materials, independent and collaborative projects.

Course Objectives:

Upon completion of this course, the student will:

- Understand the importance of quality care for infants and toddlers
- describe the characteristics of high quality infant and toddler care settings
- describe the social and emotional needs of infants and toddlers
- describe the appropriate caregiving practices including styles of interacting and methods of guiding behavior.
- demonstrate an understanding of the ways caregiving routines support and promote the development of infants and toddlers
- demonstrate skill in assessing infant-toddler learning environment
- demonstrate the ability to plan experiences that support and promote all aspects of infants' and toddlers' development
