

Course Description and Objectives:

French 0130 is the second part of a beginner's course and French 0120 or equivalent is required. French 0120 and 0130 are equivalent to French 10, 20 and 30 with the Alberta high school curriculum. The three course high school program is condensed into two intense college courses. This course will cover more detailed grammatical patterns, including verb tenses and their uses. Aural/oral skills will continue to develop through increased use of French in class and laboratory practice.

Grade Distribution:

- Lab work/Workbook......7.5% (Five "paquets" due at the end of each chapter, each worth 1.5%)
- Paragraphs......7.5% (Five written compositions, each worth 1.5%)
- Chapter Tests......50% (Five tests approximately every two week, each worth 10%)
- On-Line Tests......5% (1% for each chapter) www.mhhe.com/visavis4
- Mid-term oral exam5% (One on one interviews in my office)
- Final oral exam5% (One on one interviews in my office)
- Final written exam......20% (Final written exam scheduled by registrar)

Course expectations

- Students are expected to attend all classes. Regular attendance in any language class is <u>essential</u> as new language structures are introduced daily. The onus for covering missed work rests upon the student.
- 2. Absence from class is not an excuse for missing an exam or an assignment. Students with unexcused absences will receive a 'O' for missed assignments or tests. Requests to make up tests will only be considered if you have made arrangements with the instructor <u>before</u> the original test date. Only one test and/or quiz is permitted to be made up over the course of the semester. The request to make up the test/quiz is left to the discretion of the instructor.
- Students may request <u>only once</u> during the course a one-day time extension for an assignment.
- 4. All homework and assignments are considered <u>individual</u> projects. Copied work is very easy to spot and will be treated as cheating.
- Students are advised to familiarize themselves with those sections of the College Calendar which pertain to dates of withdrawals, cheating, academic disqualification, and student rights and responsibilities.
- Students are expected to treat the 2 hour lab component <u>as class time</u>. To be successful, students should expect one hour of homework for every hour spent in class.
