EVALUATION DESCRIPTIONS:

To pass NP2230, students must complete all assignments and evaluation strategies.

1. Communication Paper

Students will write a scholarly paper outlining their understanding of therapeutic communication and relational practice in mental health nursing. Students will include a discussion on the various communication strategies for various health care settings for mental health clients.

Topics discussed should include:

- How can nurses enhance the development of a successful nurse-patient relationship.
- What are the stages of the nurse-patient relationship?
- What factors can hinder the development of a professional relationship.
- Discuss therapeutic communication strategies nurses may utilize.
- Discuss nontherapeutic communication strategies.
- How may we consider the culture of our patients when establishing relationships?
- Other factors you think are important to communication in nursing.

Please use APA 7th edition formatting. Include a title page and reference page. Maximum of seven (7) pages double spaced including title page and reference page.

The Communication Paper rubric has been attached to the course outline and has been posted on the NP2230 myClass site.

2. In-Class Case Study Critical Thinking Assignment:

Students will be given a case study assignment and expected to complete it during scheduled class time and will be expected to answer questions based on the information presented in the case study. This case study assignment is to be administered the same as a course exam. The case study will test the student's ability to think critically about the care of a patient experiencing a mental health disorder. Students are expected to complete this assignment on an individual basis. Student absences from this assignment will be graded as zero. A physician's note will be required for absences due to illness. Any acts of cheating or incidences of academic dishonesty will result in a grade of zero. Any additional material used to complete the case study assignment is at the instructor's discretion.

3. Final Exam

The final exam includes all content covered throughout the course. Question format includes a variety of styles including, but not limited to, multiple choice, short answer, long answer, matching, and select all that apply. See course calendar for date of final exam.
