Students will complete three projects:

- 1. a presentation on a topic about Cree Culture or Language;
- 2. a 1000 word essay on topic of interest in language or culture;
- 3. an oral presentation on any structural aspect of the language or culture.

Quizzes:

OBJECTIVES (OPTIONAL):

Students will be able to comprehend simple sentences written in Roman Orthography, through their knowledge of vocabulary, word agreement, word order and association. Students will also be able to interpret and write in Cree Syllabics. Individual projects will be done both in written and presented orally in class. There will be in class and some take home assignments throughout this term. Often the structure is provided for you through class lectures. Attendance and participation are very important in this course. Students will not be allowed to reschedule missed quizzes or assignments unless they provide a valid reason
