**CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:** This course is an introduction to the characteristics of a variety of school-age learners and their education. Emphasis will be placed on the Educational Assistant's role in supporting the student with varied needs within the classroom. Specifically, the following disabilities will be covered: learning disabilities, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, emotional or behavioral disorders, communication disorders, auditory and visual impairments, low-incidence, multiple and severe disabilities, physical disabilities, and giftedness.

### **REQUIRED TEXT/RESOURCE MATERIALS:** None

**DELIVERY MODE(S):** This is an in person class comprised of lecture, audio-visual, hands on experiences and group work.

#### COURSE OBJECTIVES: The course introduces students to:

- the historical background of society's treatment of individuals with disabilities.
- the etiology of a variety of disabling conditions.
- signs and symptoms of various disabilities.

- best practices when supporting children with varied ability in the classroom.
- familial issues when a child presents with a disability.

LEARNING OUTCOMES: Upon completion of the course learners will be able to:

- Describe the language, physical and attitudinal barriers encountered by individuals with exceptionalities and their families.
- Compare and contrast the uses and abuses of labeling individuals with exceptionalities.
- Describe the roles of professionals supporting individuals with exceptionalities.
- Identify resources and program options for individuals who require additional supports.
- Identify the unique qualities, needs and concerns of families of individuals with exceptional needs and abilities.
- Describe the major categories of exceptionalities of individuals.
