Early Learning and Child Care

Motion: Recommend that Academic Council approve a modification to the program progression criteria for the Early Learning and Child Care program to "Students who fail two or more courses worth two or more credits in a semester will be placed on contractual departmental probation for the following semester. Failure to meet the probation requirements may result in forced withdrawal from the full-time program for one full semester. Readmission to the program will be subject to departmental review.

Students who fail three courses worth two or more credits will be required to withdraw for one full semester from the full time program. Readmission to the program **on a part time basis** will be subject to departmental review.

If you have successfully completed the requirements for a Certificate in Early Learning and Child Care with a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 1.7 2.0 you may proceed to the diploma program..."

Teacher Assistant

Motion: Recommend that Academic Council approve a modification to the program progression criteria and the graduation criteria for the Teacher Assistant program to:

"Program Progression: Students who fail two courses worth two or more credits in a semester will be placed on contractual departmental probation for the following semester. Failure to meet the probation requirements may result in forced withdrawal from the full-time program for one full semester. Readmission to the program will be subject to departmental review.

Students who fail three courses worth two or more credits will be required to withdraw for one full semester from the full time program. Readmission to the program on a part time basis will be subject to departmental review.

Graduation Requirements: to complete the Certificate requirements, you must achieve a minimum grade of D in all courses (with the exception of the practicum course in which a grade of CR is required) and maintain a cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 1.7 2.0. Moved: D. McArthur Second: B. Howey Discussion: This change allows for more flexibility and provides opportunity for students to return on a part time basis who would previously have been required to withdraw. The change of the GPA from 1.7 to 2.0 ensures a higher level of competency for students to be successful in the program and makes it more consistent with other GPRC certificate and diploma programs.

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a) There is clear statistical evidence that a Year One cohort of 10 Full Load Equivalents (FLEs) can be achieved.

b) The curriculum and proposed budget have been reviewed, resubmitted and approved through the Program Registry System (PRS) of Advanced Education and Technology.

It was agreed that funding needs to be available to support the recommended process.
