**CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:**

The adult’s role in supporting young children’s learning and development with an emphasis on a child-centered, play-based approach to curriculum planning will be examined in this course. Appropriate child centered routines, schedules, transitions, and group times will also be discussed. The focus is on children from birth to age 6.

**PREREQUISITE(S):** CD 1330 or consent of the department.

**REQUIRED TEXT/RESOURCE MATERIALS:**

Several readings/resources will be placed in MyClass; it is your responsibility to become familiar with this learning tool and to check it regularly.

**DELIVERY MODE(S):** Classroom instruction will include a combination of lectures, discussions, small and large group work. Audio-visual materials and other resources will also be used.

- Describe the ways play contributes to children's development.
- Provide materials and experiences that support children's play, learning and development
- Describe the role of the adult in supporting and extending play through observing, planning and participating in activities with children.
- Develop learning centers that include developmentally appropriate materials and experiences to support and enhance children's learning and development
- Plan program components including schedules, routines, transitions, and group times
