Full time student in NWP Harley-Davidson® Certificate Program

REQUIRED MATERIALS:

Working laptop/other computer

DELIVERY MODE(S):

Units are self-paced and are completed outside normal classroom hours.

All units are online via the H-Dnet training portal & may be viewed on personal PC or Mac computers or mobile devices.

The Harley-Davidson® online units may be transferred to a new H-Dnet account upon the student gaining employment at an authorized dealership.
