



The delivery mode will consist of lectures explaining grammatical concepts, vocabulary, and cultural elements as well as group and individual oral, written, and reading exercises reinforcing these concepts. In preparation for exams, most of class time will focus on the essential *Contextes, Structures, Vocabulaire, and Expressions utiles of Promenades (Chapters 1-5)*. As time permits, students will also be introduced to the *Roman-photo, Lecture culturelle, Synthèse, Écriture and Savoir-Faire* sections, work on practice quizzes, and become capable of working independently both inside and outside of class. In addition, a combined **Workbook/Lab manual** with online reference is to be completed by students and provides opportunity for repetition and self-correction.

## LEARNING OUTCOMES:

At the end of the semester, the student who completes this course will be able to:

- read and understand short sentences, conversations, and texts;
- write simple sentences and paragraphs using basic grammatical structures and verb tenses (present, and near future) to ask and answer questions or express themselves at a fundamental level;
- understand simple expressions, questions, and conversations in French;
- speak and interact using basic grammatical structures, vocabulary, and verb tenses to express themselves on common topics;
- understand common cultural expressions;
- and appreciate the French culture in a diverse French-speaking world.

- **Unit tests/Tests d'unités.** – There are four unit Tests and each unit will take about **TWO/THREE WEEKS** to cover. - **Final Exam.** – A final comprehensive written exam consisting of written, listening/comprehension parts will be scheduled by the Registrar. The Oral Exam will take place with a partner during the last week of classes.
