CALENDAR DESCRIPTION: This intermediate university course is a continuation of spoken and written French, and enhances further skills in listening, comprehension, pronunciation, grammar, production, literature, and French/Francophone culture.

- A good French-English dictionary is recommended.
- Supplementary materials will be used for extra practice.

DELIVERY MODE(S): On-Campus

The teaching of this course is based on Chapters 6-10 of *Imaginez*. The textbook presents practical vocabulary related to the lesson theme, authentic short films by award-winning francophone filmmakers, cultural readings and video clips of the francophone world, structures and *Fiches de grammaire*, and authentic literary selections by writers from diverse francophone countries. Most of our in-class time will focus on this material. Beside the textbook, the *Imaginez* Supersite

provides you with many additional activities and a complete Lab Program. In addition, the ‘Supersite Plus’ offers you the WebSAM: the online Student Activities Manual is to be completed for the most part on your own and will give you supplemental practice using language elements introduced from the textbook in class.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

After successfully completing this course,

- expanding their lexical knowledge through a wide range of practical vocabulary related to the lesson themes of the textbook;
- communicate in predictable and some unpredictable situations with few grammatical and vocabulary errors;
- understand short literary and cultural readings;
- write compositions using complex sentences and more advanced grammatical structures and tenses (future simple, subjonctif, conditionnel, hypothèses);
- understand short films and authentic video clips from the francophone world;
- continue their appreciation of the French culture in a diverse French-speaking world (L’Afrique du Nord et le Liban, la Belgique, La Suisse et le Luxembourg, L’océan Indien, L’Afrique Centrale, La Polynésie française, la Nouvelle-Calédonie, l’Asie).

1. **Chapter Tests** – There are four chapter tests. Upon completion of each test, students will gain feedback on their progress through a written chapter test. Chapter tests cannot be made up, but in the case of a medical emergency with an official doctor’s note, may be excused.
2. **Compositions / Rédactions** – There are four compositions. The topics will be posted on D2L (Myclass) and should be enriched with vocabulary and grammar learned within each “Leçon”. Compositions are due with title, name and date on the due date for grading. **DO NOT** use Google Translate or any other translation site. Also, AI detection software will be used for written compositions.
3. **Oral Presentation** – Students will prepare and deliver an oral PowerPoint presentation during class time on a French-speaking (or francophone) country.
4. **Workbook / Cahier d’exercices (online)** – Language acquisition depends on contact with and repeated use of concepts taught in class. The Workbook Manual is accessible online and is to be completed and submitted for grading online outside of class time. The online Supersite provides many additional activities to support you with many possible opportunities to hear, speak, and read French. **Workbooks are graded online.**
5. **Final Exam** (oral & written) – A final cumulative written exam consisting of written, reading, comprehension, and listening parts will be scheduled by the Registrar. The Oral exam will take place during the last week of classes.
