Scholarly Assignment:

Students will be required to write a 1000-word (excluding the title page, in-text citations, and reference pages) scholarly paper with proper APA (7th edition) formatting. The purpose of this assignment is to give students an opportunity to focus on select concepts in more depth and explore the nurse's roles and responsibilities in promoting optimal health and wellness for a particular age and cultural group who live with an acute, episodic, or chronic illness. In-Class Case Studies:

Students will be provided with a case study based on one of the concepts covered in the course. The case study will be submitted at the end of class. Students may complete this assignment in partners or individually.

Attendance in class is required to receive a grade on this assignment. Absence in the class will result in a 0. Make-up assignments will not be provided.

Midterm and Final Examinations:

Content that will be covered in the exams includes all preparatory work on MyClass and theory class. Exams are cumulative, meaning that concepts tested in the first exam will be tested in the second exam to ensure students have built a strong foundation of knowledge and understanding.

Late Assignment Policy:

To obtain credit in the course ALL assignments, examinations, and quizzes must be completed.

Students are expected to make every effort to complete assignments on time. Assignment submissions are expected on the date determined by faculty. If extensions are necessary, they may be requested up to 48 hours prior to the assignment due date and should be submitted in writing to the



faculty member involved. Not all extensions will be granted. In exceptional situations, extension requests within the 48-hour period may be considered. Late assignments will have 5% of total marks (or one letter grade) for the assignment deducted for each day/partial day (including weekend days) beyond the due time. For example, a paper marked at B+ would receive an adjusted grade of B if handed in one day late. After 5 days, a grade of 0 will be awarded to the assignment. If the late penalty places the grade below the necessary pass grade, students will be unsuccessful in the course. When submitting assignments electronically, it is the student's responsibility to ensure the assignment has been received. Papers/assignments may not be rewritten for a higher grade. Concerns regarding grading are to be discussed with the faculty member involved.
