### Calendar Description:

Introduction to basic principles and techniques of studio painting.

## Course Description:

Painting I is an introductory level studio course that will introduce basic techniques of painting, colour theory, and perception. Various approaches and conceptual attitudes will be examined to broaden the student's appreciation of painting.

# Course in Perspective:

AR 1100 is designed to help develop basic perceptual and painterly skills primarily throughout the use of various media. Slides, films, and lectures will be used to demonstrate specific examples and to broaden student awareness of individual artists and their work.

Visits to the Prairie Gallery and/or private galleries/studios will be encouraged.

# Course Objectives:

- To simultaneously develop a technical ability in manipulating media and a sensitivity toward its use.
- To develop an increase in conceptual awareness beyond that of basic perceptual and recording relationships.

## Course Breakdown:

The following units will be examined in this course. The instructor may cover several of these points in any one given lecture/assignment.

#### Unit I:

- introduction to course structure, requirements and materials
- recap of basic two dimensional design
- nature and function of painting and drawing

### Unit II:

- drawing with paint on paper
- developing of line and valve
- wet into wet, overpainting, dry brush

### Unit III:

- gesture and expressive use of paint to describe surface, texture and pattern accidental
- complimentary, warm-cool figure-ground colour relationships

#### Unit IV:

- development of depth
- saturation and intensity of colour
- colour systems, neutral colours

## Unit V:

development of mass, light, shadow, and the illusion of space

## Unit VI:

- glaze techniques
- transparent and opaque paint

## Unit VII:

open projects (contract basis)
