AR1130 Painting 11 is an introductory-level studio course that will introduce basic techniques of painting, color theory and perception. Various approaches and conceptual ideas will be examined to broarden the students appreciation of painting.

Calendar Description

Introduction to the basic principles and techniques of studio painting. A continuation of AR 1120 Painting 1.

Course Perspective

AR 1130 is designed to introduce various conceptual approaches to the acrylic painting media. Introduction to acrylic painting techniques such as acrylic wash painting and glazing techniques. How to work with opaque painting media in isolation and in combination with various acrylic painting and mixed media.

Course Objectives
