Description:

This printmaking studio course is designed to give students a foundation in the areas of intaglio and lithography processes. Emphasis will be placed on the principles and techniques of intaglio and lithography printmaking, while simultaneously exploring expressive uses of the printmaking media.

Objectives:

- To introduce intaglio and lithography printmaking.
- To learn basic technical aspects of working in these media.
- 3. To develop aesthetic appreciation of print media.
- To understand the technical vocabulary of printmaking.
- To acquire the confidence to apply these techniques to artistic expression of your ideas.
- To expose the student to the history of each printmaking medium and to show the trends of contemporary printmakers.
- To emphasize to the student their dual role of artist and printer.

Course Requirements:

- Regular attendance is necessary. After two unexcused absences marks will be deducted.
- In order to complete required work, all students are encourages to use the printmaking studio facilities beyond lab periods.
- All students are to participate and present work during critiques.
- Students will be marked on shop cleanliness and respect for materials and equipment.
- Completion of a sufficient body of work to show competence in handling the various media.

Class Structure:

Classes will be devoted to:

- printmaking editioning and proofing
- critiques and discussions on printmaking assignments
- demonstration and slide presentations

Assessment:

Final portfolio and journal must be submitted during last class after group critique.
