### **OBJECTIVES**

**IMPORTANT!** 

Students upon completion of this course will:

- 1. Exhibit a working knowledge of the fundamentals of sculpture including:
  - The various characteristics of sculptural media.
  - The preparation of a variety of sculptural media (like clay, plaster, cement, wood, found material and others.)
  - Various ways of sculpting, advantages and disadvantages, both traditional and experimental focusing on additive and reductive methods.
- 2. Identify and apply fundamental principles of composition as related to sculpture (harmony, balance, rhythm, repetition, dominance, variety) using the elements of visual art (line, shape, value, texture and colour.)
- 3. Perceive visual relationships in the environment and record these perceptions as sculptures.
- 4. Develop confidence and competence in as wide a variety of media as possible.
  - 5. Demonstrate a critical understanding of sculpture through verbal discussion of work in class critique.
    - 6. Develop an awareness of visual culture in the three dimensions.
