- What: Drawing II is a 3 credit studio course that continues AR 2430. Drawing II continues to explore the basic concepts of drawing and perception. Various approaches and conceptual attitudes will be examined to broaden the student's appreciation of drawing and visual culture.
- · Why: See "Objectives."
- Text book:"Drawing Lessons from the Great Masters" by Robert Hale. Published by Wasson and Guptill, 1989.

Students upon completion of this course will:

- 1. Exhibit a working knowledge of the fundamentals of drawing:
 - The various characteristics drawing media including pencil, charcoal, ink and others.
 - · Gesture, contour, perspective and figure drawing.
 - Various ways of applying drawing media advantages and disadvantages, both traditional and experimental.
 - · Drawing and collage.
- Identify and apply fundamental principles of composition as related to drawing(harmony, balance, rhythm, repetition, dominance, variety) using the elements of visual art (line, shape, value, texture.)
- Perspective, using the principles of depth perception, to record the illusion of three dimensions using: overlapping, advancing and receding value, mechanical perspective, diminishing size and detail, tonal modeling.
- Perceive visual relationships in the environment and record these perceptions as drawing.
 - Develop confidence and competence in the verbal discussion of these top ics.
 - 6. Develop an awareness of visual culture.

WHAT THE COURSE IS ABOUT.

READING AND/OR HOME ASSIGNMENTS:

- Students can expect to put in a minimum of Six (6) HOURS PER WEEK on out-of-class work.
- Assignments are expected on the date required. Failure to complete projects on time for class critiques will effect the student's final evaluation.

- Demonstration of a professional attitude, indicated by enthusiasm, commitment, involvement and flexibility in collective and individual critiques.
