OBJECTIVES: AR2830 is an exploration of the key developments in the visual arts in Canada in context of Canadian history and international trends. The objective of this course is not solely the acquisition of a body of facts composed of names of artists and dates of artwork— it is an exploration of Canadian culture and identity as illustrated through the visual arts (Painting, Architecture and Sculpture).
