Course Content: AR 3410 will explore the use of monochromatic and

color media in drawing. Various methods of represent-ing space and describing form will be explored. Development

of a personal style will be encouraged.

Objectives:

 Learn the basic principles of two-dimensional design: line, shape, value, texture, color, tone and composition.

 Manipulate the elements of visual art on a twodimensional surface through the application of depth of depth perception (overlapping, mechanical perspective, diminishing size and detail, tonal modeling).

Perceive visual relationships in the environment and record these perceptions in terms of the elements of visual arts.

 Exhibit a basic working knowledge of the fundamental techniques and materials of drawing including the use of pencil, conte, charcoal, pen and ink, brush, watercolor, colored pencils and collage.

Development the basic skills to render and record the human form.

- Criteria for Evaluation: 1. The level of creativity and craftsmanship demonstrated.
  - 2. The degree of knowledge and understanding of the elements and principles of this particular studio discipline.
  - Portfolio presentations will be required throughout the duration of this course.
  - 4. Professional orientation as indicated by enthusiasm, commitment, involvement and flexibility in collective and individual critiques.
