Course Descriptions:

AR 3410 is designed to develop the previously introduced perceptual, expressive, and recording 10 skills through the use of various wet and dry media. Figure and still-life situations will form a significant percentage of this terms work.

- Assignments will normally be given every week. Students will be expected to invest a minimum 2. of six hours a week on our of class work. Assignments must be presented the following week or assigned day. This will be reinforced.
- 3. Instructions, assignments, and lectures will commence promptly at the beginning of each class and will not be repeated for the benefit of late-corners.
- Visits to art galleries/studios will be encouraged. This will be assigned as homework for the 4 students if class is missed due to travel.
- MAD Friday will be inplace this year. This is mandatory for everyone!!! You must show up for 5. at least four of the six lectures. Attendance will be taken at the door.
- Professional Orientation as indicated by commitment, and involvement in collective and 6. individual critiques, completion of assignments, meeting of deadlines and time spent additional to class hours.

Notes:

Students will be expected to invest a minimum of six hours a week on out of class work.

- Verbally criticize and critique issues within the students, peers and historic work.
