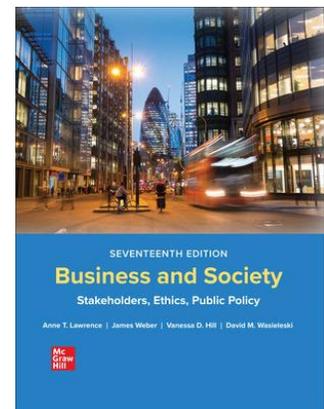

DELIVERY MODE(S):

Asynchronous (online) – This type of course will be delivered online through NWP’s learning management system. There are no set class times and students attend remotely and asynchronously.

This is a paced online self-study course. You will work through the course content in the order presented, completing all textbook readings, Connect chapter SmartBook 2.0 exercises, quizzes, and assignments before progressing to the next week. Please adhere to the course weekly schedule (see section below).

The course is delivered entirely online using NWP MyClass software and the McGraw-Hill Connect Online SmartBook 2.0 (Connect). For each chapter, a MS PowerPoint presentation is available. Relevant SmartBook exercises for each chapter will be assigned as well as periodic Connect quizzes to test your knowledge, understanding, and application of the material throughout the course. You will be evaluated several times so you can assess how you are doing as you work through the material.
