### **REQUIRED TEXT/RESOURCE MATERIALS:**

### **CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:**

This course provides an introduction to the central role of play in early learning and child care settings, with an emphasis on developmentally appropriate, culturally sensitive practices. This course focuses on a number of topics including the nature value, and types of play, as well as important theories and issues regarding play. Students will also learn about the role of the practitioner in play, including the use of appropriate observation and documentation to understand and support children's development though play.

# CREDIT/CONTACT HOURS/ DELIVERY MODE(S): 3

Classroom instruction will include a combination of lectures, as well as small and large group work. Audio-visual material and additional resources will also be used.

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Understand the importance of play in children's life and how it benefits them.
- Classify children's play episodes, using the categories of play identified by Parten and Piaget.
- Identify specific skills that are learned through play activities
- Use appropriate and objective observation and documentation tools and techniques to understand, and interpret children's play.
- Articulate the role of the practitioner in facilitating, supporting, and extending children's play.
- Identify how to meet developmental goals with play activities
- List ways that a provider can support and encourage learning through play

# Assignment 1: "Back to basics, What is play?"10%

#### Due date: February 3rd, 2014

Objective: Understand the importance of play in children's life and how it benefits them and identify specific skills that are learned through play activities.

#### **Description**:

- ✓ Observe 2 children while playing during free play or outside (observe each child at least for 20 minutes).
- ✓ Take pictures of each child engaged in play.
- $\checkmark$  Take notes of what each child SAID and DID, and write down with detail what they did (in an objective way).
- ✓ Identify the skills that each child learned through play
- ✓ Give your instructor a written summary of this. (Template provided by instructor)

 \*Please note, that if you take pictures of the children at your practicum placement, you must have signed permission, from the child's parent to use their picture. This MUST be submitted with your assignment. If it is not, a '0' will be given.

### Assignment 2: "Types of play, PART 1" 10%

#### Due date: February 24th, 2014

**Objective:** Classify children's play episodes, using the categories of play identified by Mildred Parten.

#### Description:

- $\checkmark$  Go to a classroom and observe the children in the room while playing.
- ✓ As soon as you identify a type of play, take a picture of it! (you will need to have the photos on your written assignment. You will need at least 5 photos, but you can provide more (1 for each type of play).
- ✓ Complete the template. (Template provided by instructor)
  - Describe why you think that specific type of play corresponds to the photo that you took and specify what the children were doing at that moment.
- ✓ \*Please note, that if you take pictures of the children in the classroom, you
  must have signed permission, from the child's parent to use their picture. This
  MUST be submitted with your assignment. If it is not, a '0' will be given.

### Assignment 3: "Types of play, PART 2" 10%

#### Due date: March 17th, 2014

**Objective:** Classify children's play episodes, using the categories of play identified by Jean Piaget.

#### Description:

- $\checkmark$  Go to a classroom and observe the children in the room while playing.
- ✓ As soon as you identify a type of play, take a picture of it! (you will need to have the photos on your written assignment. You will need at least 5 photos, but you can provide more (1 for each type of play).
- ✓ Complete the template. (Template provided by instructor)

- Describe why you think that specific type of play corresponds to the photo that you took and specify what the children were doing at that moment.
- \*Please note, that if you take pictures of the children in the classroom, you must have signed permission, from the child's parent to use their picture. This MUST be submitted with your assignment. If it is not, a '0' will be given.

### Assignment 4: "Observations" 10%

#### Due date: April 7th, 2014

**Objective:** Use appropriate and objective observation and documentation tools and techniques to understand, and interpret children's play.

#### Description:

- ✓ Choose one child to observe in one of your practicum sites OR in the Children's Centre Demonstration Preschool Program. (If you are not registered in CD 1045, you will have to make arrangements to observe a child in the Children's Centre. You may not complete these observations on your own child for this last assignment)
- ✓ Using the information you have gained in class and the various handouts about observing and recording children's behavior as resources, complete two 20- minute observations of the child at play.
- ✓ Create a Running Record (using Instructor's template)
- ✓ Create an Anecdotal Record (using Instructor's template)

# IN CLASS ASSIGNMENTS (GROUP WORK) 10%

We will have 2 IN CLASS, group assignments. Each group assignment will be worth 5% of your final grade.

# QUIZZES 10%
