COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course explores the interrelationship between self-concept, self-awareness and effective communication. Concepts relating to group dynamics will be explored and skills in working with groups will be developed. Strategies for recognizing and dealing with stress and conflict will be examined.

PREREQUISITES: Successful completion of the first year of the Early Childhood Development program or permission of the department.

TEXT: The required course materials will be provided by the ECD program. Access to a computer is essential.

OBJECTIVES: Upon completion of this course, you should be able to:

- discuss the relationship between self-concept and interpersonal relationships
- discuss the influence of self-disclosure in forming and maintaining effective interpersonal relationships
- describe the influences of stress on job performance and personal well-being
- describe strategies to effectively manage stress
- demonstrate skills in identifying and resolving conflict in the workplace
- demonstrate skills in working effectively with others in a group

TEACHING METHODS: This course will be delivered using a combination of online course materials and face-face tutorials.
