Course Objectives: The objective of this course is to:

- \* introduce students to the personality theories of the behaviourists: Sigmund Freud, Alfred Adler,, Erik Erikson, Carl Rogers, Ivan Pavlov, B.F. Skinner, and Abraham Maslow
- \* evaluate the contributions made by the above psychologists to the study of human personality
- \* aid students in understanding their own personality development
- \* help students cope more effectively with the normal problems of maturation and growth
