COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is an introduction to the use of the computer in a fine arts context. The main application studied will be Adobe PhotoShop on the Macintosh platform which is the primary digital image manipulation program used to create graphics and art for use in print, the Internet and interactive multi-media. In addition students will learn the basics of computer pixel theory and the fundamentals of working with "raster-bitmap" image graphics.

OBJECTIVES:

Students will:

1. Learn the basic principles of two-dimensional design: line, shape, value, texture, color, tone and composition.
2. Develop an awareness of the impact the computer is having on modern society/culture.
3. Develop the visual and critical thinking skills pertaining to creating effective imagery.
4. Gain the necessary computer skills and techniques for effective communication.

READING HOME ASSIGNMENTS:

Students can expect to put in a minimum of 10 hours per week on out-of-class work. Assignments will be expected on the date required. Failure to complete projects on time for class critiques will effect the student's final evaluation. **Food and drinks are not permitted in the computer lab!! Students are responsible for clean up of the lab. Good Housekeeping is essential.**

CRITERIA FOR EVALUATION:

1. The level of creativity and craftsmanship demonstrated.
2. The degree of knowledge and understanding of the elements and principles of this particular studio discipline.
3. Portfolio presentations will be required throughout the duration of this course.
4. Overdue assignments will be penalized. Work must be completed within "10" days of the original deadline and students will be **penalized 10% for each day late. Assignments beyond the 10 day period will receive a "0" grade.**
5. Professional orientation as indicated by enthusiasm, commitment, involvement and flexibility in collective and individual critiques.

ASSESSMENT AND GRADING:

Mid-term: 35% Grade based on assignments completed by **Thursday, October 14, 1999.**

Final: 35% Grade based on final portfolio by **Thursday, December 9, 1999.**

Exams: 15% Grade based on an average of short quizzes throughout the term.

MAD Friday Presentation Attendance: 5% of final grade based on attendance by **Fine Art students pursuing a Fine Arts Certificate, Fine Arts Diploma, IDD Diploma and the first 2 years of a Bachelor of Education (Fine Arts Major) or Bachelor of Fine Arts are required to attend 4 out of 6 presentations each semester and 1 performance. Attendance at less than 4 will result in a deduction of 5% each semester.**

Involvement: 10% Grade based on participation, critique contributions, class attendance.

NOTE:

More than 20% absenteeism from class will result in the student being asked to leave the class. Further, if students fail to complete and submit 85% of the grade requirements of the term mark they will not be allowed to complete the course. In such a case, the student will automatically receive a failing grade of DB (debarred). See p.23 of the 1999/2000 Calendar for more details.

MATERIALS/SUPPLY LIST: Estimated costs approximately \$60.00 for Zip cartridges. It is highly recommended that you make back up copies of your work.

IMPORTANT NOTICES:

1. Unless otherwise directed by the instructor, all work produced for the course **must be retained until after the final assessment at the end of the term.**
