Application of two-dimensional art elements applied to Digital Media: drawing, image manipulation, colour, composition and typography, using appropriate current software.

Course Content:

Using the vector-based Adobe Illustrator 10 students will explore, design, and create assignments for presentation on paper as well as construct 3-dimensional pieces. The course will focus on design for print media and there will be discussions and presentations on topics including: software instruction; theories & history of design and typography; semantics (meaning of words); colour theory; and semiotics (meaning of signs &

symbols).

Evaluation: Mid-term: 45% Grade based on assignments and worksheets completed by midterm.

Final: 45% Grade based on assignments and worksheets from midterm to the end of the

semester.

Involvement: 10% Grade based on participation, critique contributions, class attendance.
