**ELECTRONIC PUBLISHING I**

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This course is an intermediate level studio course to prepare students for the growing field of electronic publishing. With the emergence of the desktop computer, many of the tools of the layout artist have become available in standard word processors and desktop publishing software packages. The traditional skills associated with the publishing industry such as page layout, design, typography and pre-press work have now become valuable skills for all information-related industries.

**COURSE IN PRESPECTIVE:**

DD2260 is an introductory course to desktop publishing focusing on basic design, and pre-press concepts as related to the print industry. This course will focus on design principles as related to typography, graphic design including the placement of text, images and the use of color as an effective means of visual communication. This course will also examine the impact of the computer on the printed word. The applications used in this course will be Adobe Illustrator, Adobe PhotoShop, Adobe PageMaker and Quark Xpress.

**OBJECTIVES:**

Students will:

1. Learn the basic principles of two-dimensional design: line, shape, value, texture, color, tone and composition.
2. Examine and explore the use of text and imagery as a means of visual communication.
3. Develop the basic computer skills and techniques applicable to page layout programs.
4. Learn Pre-press skills and requirements.

**FIELD TRIP:**

All students are expected to go on a class field trip scheduled for the week of October 18 to October 22, 1999. Cost for travel and accommodation: Approximately \$250.00. Meals and spending costs will be in addition to the above amount.

#### READING HOME ASSIGNMENTS:

Students can expect to put in a minimum of 10 hours per week on out-of-class work. Assignments will be expected on the date required. Failure to complete projects on time for class critiques will effect the student's final evaluation. **Food and drinks are not permitted in the computer lab!! Students are responsible for clean up of the lab. Good Housekeeping is essential.**

#### CRITERIA FOR EVALUATION:

1. The level of creativity and craftsmanship demonstrated.
2. The degree of knowledge and understanding of the elements and principles of this particular studio discipline.
3. Portfolio presentations will be required throughout the duration of this course.
4. Overdue assignments will be penalized. Work must be completed within "10" days of the original deadline and students will be **penalized 10% for each day late. Assignments beyond the 10 day period will receive a "0" grade.**
5. Professional orientation as indicated by enthusiasm, commitment, involvement and flexibility in collective and individual critiques.

#### ASSESSMENT AND GRADING:

Mid-term: 35% Grade based on assignments completed by **Wednesday, October 13, 1999.**

Final: 35% Grade based on final portfolio by **Wednesday, December 8, 1999.**

Exams: 15% Grade based on an average of short quizzes throughout the term.

MAD Friday Presentation Attendance: 5% of final grade based on attendance by **Fine Art students pursuing a Fine Arts Certificate, Fine Arts Diploma, IDD Diploma and the first 2 years of a Bachelor of Education (Fine Arts Major) or Bachelor of Fine Arts are required to attend 4 out of 6 presentations each semester and 1 performance. Attendance at less than 4 will result in a deduction of 5% each semester.**

Involvement: 10% Grade based on participation, critique contributions, class attendance.

NOTE:

More than 20% absenteeism from class will result in the student being asked to leave the class. Further, if students fail to complete and submit 85% of the grade requirements of the term, they will not be allowed to complete the course. In such a case, the student will automatically receive a failing grade of DB (debarred). See p.23 of the 1999/2000 Calendar for more details.
