Calendar Description:

DR 1200 is a production-based class where learning is centered on acting in a major production. This course is required by Drama Majors. Enrollment is through auditions to be held November 23 and 25, 2008. Students must pre-

register with the instructor for their audition time. Students who are cast in the play will receive course credit for their work. Students must read the play before they audition – 2 copies will be available in the GPRC Library on

reserve.

Course Content:

The course content is the learning, rehearsing, and presenting of the chosen play in 11 public performances. The play to be produced during the 2008/09 Winter session is an original work being created in honor of the Arctic Winter Games. The performance dates are February 25 to 27, and Mar 4 to 6, 2010. The course is an 10 week intensive, requiring some rehearsal hours in

December and 10 to 15 hours per week of class/rehearsal time, expecting production week (Feb 22 to 27) to be the most intensive week with both

daytime and evening rehearsals and performances.

Evaluation: Class participation (rehearsals and performances) 70%, written assignments

(actor's journal, character development work, and a reflection paper) 30%.
