| Course Content:       | The course content is the learning, rehearsing, and presenting of the chosen play in 7 public performances. The play to be produced during the 2010/11 Winter session is <i>The Blue Light</i> by the awarding winning Alberta playwright, Mieko Ouchi. The performance dates are March 3 to 12, 2011. The course is an 10 week intensive, requiring some rehearsal hours in December and 9 to 12 hours per week of class/rehearsal time, expecting the two production weeks to be the most intensive weeks with both daytime and evening rehearsals and performances. The last class will be March 18. |
| Evaluation:           | Class participation (rehearsals and performances) 70%, written assignments (actor's journal, character development work, and a reflection paper) 30%.   |
