### COURSE OBJECTIVES:

To explore and develop the actor's instrument: understanding the connection between mind, body and voice.

To develop skills in various styles of improvisation and scripted drama and to apply them in ensemble work (which will result in performances)

To encourage self-assessment through written work.

To develop the student's creative ability.

#### COURSE CONTENT:

In class participation: this involves all activities which occur during class time. You are required to fully participate.

Written work: Using the text and class content, the student will answer questions as provided by the instructor on a weekly basis. Written work will be collected regularly and must be maintained and up to date.

# Group Projects:

- The Lantern Tour: Performed at the Museum October 19th & 20th in the
  evenings Friday and Saturday. This is a collective production which changes each year as
  the scripts will be written by you after research and rehearsal in the various buildings at the
  Museum.
- 2) Final Projects: Performed in the Black Box Studio (your classroom) during regular class time Nov 27 & 29 and Dec. 4th & 6th open to the public. These will be 20 minute scripted performances you will write and act in in groups to be determined by class size.

Community: The Fine Arts is a community of skilled people working together to produce an environment that fascilitates creativity. We ask that you participate (behind the scenes) in this arts community by assisting the Production Assistant (Sharon Kimble) on one Fine Arts event.

Attendance: This course (and thus your grade) relies on Group Work. Absences are unacceptable and will result in failure in this course. Only a doctor's note can release you from class time without penalty.
