REQUIRED TEXT/RESOURCE MATERIALS: Wadsworth Anthology of Drama, Brief 5th Edition

CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:

This course explores the theory and context of European theatre from ancient Greece to the Renaissance. Topics include: Setting the stage; development and craft of Mise-en-scene and of the relationship between the stage and the audience.

DELIVERY MODE(S): Lecture

OBJECTIVES:

The development of European theatre will be approached through reading and discussing plays from different historical periods beginning with the Comedy and Tragedy of the Golden Age of Greece, the Roman Empire, the Middle Ages, to the Renaissance. Plays from different European countries will be considered (some in translation), paying attention to the political events of the times, social customs, literary trends, and theatre architecture and technology. Students will be expected to do presentations in class, write a research paper, as well as smaller written assignments, and write a midterm and a final exam. Attendance at live theatre performance is anticipated.

Students upon completion of this course will:

1. have gained an understanding of the historical background of Western theatre from theatre texts of Classical Greece, the Middle Ages, and the Renaissance.

2. have gained an understanding of the forms of Western theatre from theatre texts of Classical Greece, the Middle Ages, and the Renaissance.

3. have explored the historical contexts of theatre in these periods

4. have analyzed contemporary relationships to theatre through analysis of these historical periods

5. have gained a critical understanding of theatre through debating and applying theories of performance to the works studied

TRANSFERABILITY: UA, UL

GRADING CRITERIA:
