Prerequisite:	DR1490 and consent of Supervising Instructor. The Supervising Instructor may waive DR1490 in exceptional circumstances. The student must have their written project proposal, including their statement of intent, approved in writing by the Supervising Instructor before registration.		
Instructor:	PhD or MFA		
Calendar Description:	Students may pursue a project of their devising with the supervision of a faculty member. The intention of the independent project is for a student to explore an aspect of performance that is not available to them within currently accessible Drama courses. Available during F/W/S sessions with the agreement of the Supervising Instructor.		
Course Content:	Students upon completion of this course will: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. have gained experience in their chosen area of performance</li><li>2. have explored the ethics of self-motivation in performance</li><li>3. have gained experience in negotiating self-expression in a collaborative context</li><li>4. develop confidence, competence, and professionalism in performance</li><li>5. demonstrate a critical understanding of theatre through participating in performance</li><li>6. develop skill in critical self-reflection of the performance process.</li></ol>		
Grading	Documentation to be determined in a written contract negotiated between the student and supervising faculty. Pass/Fail.		
Timeline:	Overdue assignments will be penalized 10% for each day late up to a maximum of 5 (working) days (50%).		
Required Materials:	Students may identify project costs.		
Attendance:	More than 10% absenteeism may constitute a failure except for medical or extenuating circumstances in which case a doctor's letter may be required. This is a laboratory course and attendance is mandatory.
