Calendar Description:	This course allows for students to work on a long term project, or one that may occur outside of regular sessions. Students may pursue a performance project of their devising with the supervision of a faculty member. Students must have their written project proposal, including their statement of intent, approved in writing by the supervising instructor prior to registration. An independent project may take place in Spring and/or Summer semester if the supervising faculty member is available.		
Course Content:	Students upon completion of this course will: <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. have gained experience in their chosen area of performance2. have explored the ethics of self-motivation in performance3. have gained experience in negotiating self-expression in a collaborative context4. develop confidence, competence, and professionalism in performance5. demonstrate a critical understanding of theatre through participating in performance6. develop skill in critical self-reflection of the performance process.		
Grading	Documentation to be determined in a written contract negotiated between the student and supervising faculty. Pass/Fail.		
Timeline:	Overdue assignments will be penalized 5% for each day late up to a maximum of 5 (working) days (25%).		
Required Materials:	Students may identify project costs.		
Attendance:	More than 10% absenteeism may constitute a failure except for medical or extenuating circumstances in which case a doctor's letter may be required. This is a laboratory course and attendance is mandatory.
