Special Project

Students will select a topic from the textbook and prepare a poster presentation. You must research the topic, prepare references, present the material (written and poster format) and provide a handout. This is a handson project to further your knowledge about some of the theories and practices we will be covering in class.

This project will be presented to the class and possibly community members. Students may complete the project individually or work in pairs.

Specifically, design a project that addresses how to:

- (1) manage behaviors in the classroom
- (2) promote lifelong learning
- (3) motivate students
- (4) evaluate student progress
- (5) educate students with individual differences
- (6) apply Piagetian principles in the classroom
- (7) be understanding and aware of racial, gender and social class differences.
