6. **OBJECTIVES:**

- 6.1. To expose you to the actual processes of teaching and learning with the hope that your contact with educational personnel will make your experiences realistic and reliable.
- 6.2. To explore how children learn as seen through the writings of researchers in child development.
- 6.3. To come to some understanding of what children should learn in order to contribute and function in our society.

6.4. To explore ways of achieving these goals within the framework of child development.

JOURNAL

The **journal** is meant to be an account of your experience in the schools. Your thoughts, feelings, discussions with teachers and students should be included. An event in the school that you witness and wonder about or a disciplinary situation which provokes a reaction with you are examples of what might cause you to reflect about education and your desire to become an educator. Questions which arise in class discussion may also provide a framework for your journal. You should begin each class visit with a specific observational objective which is reflected in your journal. You are expected **to observe in schools for 30-40 hours** in both elementary and secondary classrooms over the term. Allow time for discussions with the teachers regarding their teaching philosophy, original motives for entering the profession, their goals, and their observations of the profession of teaching.

DISCUSSION TOPICS

- 1. What are the reasons for becoming teachers or educators?
- 2. What is meant by professional socialization? How does this process compare to experiences in other occupations?
- 3. What career rewards are associated with teaching? Would these satisfy your expectations? What are your expectations? Are differences in expectations based on gender?
- 4. What is the relationship between learning and teaching? Analyze your own experiences as students and be prepared to discuss them.
- 5. How would you define motivation? How were you motivated in school? Should the teacher accept the burden of providing the first spark?

- 6. Of the varied concepts of learning, which concept most accurately reflects the education you have received so far? What would you choose to emphasize in your classroom?
- 7. What are some of the uncertainties associated with teaching? Are they personal, psychological, or structural?
- 8. In your experience, has your performance as a student been affected by the teacher's expectations of you?
- 9. What expectations do you have of yourselves as future teachers? How would you assess whether you have met these expectations?
- 10. What are status realities? How do these affect the attitudes of teachers?
- 11. Who are the publics that we serve? Which is the most important and why?
- 12. How do we cope with bullying and its results?
- 13. What is reasonable to expect from parents as you work with their children?
- 14. Other topics include: stress management (for both teacher and student), effective utilization of time, classroom management, interpersonal relationships both in the classroom and school.
