Description: This course is for students expecting to continue into courses requiring high school level competency in English. This course provides practice in strategies, reading comprehension, vocabulary development, and basic composition skills.

Delivery Mode(s): Students will work through a series of readings, exercises and computer-assisted learning with help as required from the instructor.

Credit/Contact Hours: 5(4.5-0-3)

<u>**Objectives:**</u> This course aims to provide each student with the skills to understand and appreciate language and to use it confidently and competently for a range of purposes. Students will explore thoughts, ideas, feelings and experiences and consider diverse opinion, while acknowledging the value of the ideas and opinions of others. Students will focus on specific reading and thinking ideas using active reading strategies to help build a positive attitude toward learning.

Grading Criteria: This course is graded as CREDIT/NO CREDIT. A student must achieve a final passing mark of 50% on assignments/tests, complete all required course work, and maintain satisfactory attendance. Submission of a typed copy of the novel study (with all corrections made) is a requirement for credit in this course.

Good attendance is critical for success. If you miss more than 15% of classes per semester in any course, you may be debarred from the final exam for that course.
