DESCRIPTION:

A study of some of the major forms of English literature, concentrating primarily on works written since 1800.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

1. Encourage close reading of poems, short stories, plays and novels as a means to generate understanding of literary creativity. As the course will stress the practical criticism of particular works, it should equip the student for further study of literature.
2. Give some guidance and practice in writing in a manner that meets acceptable standards of literacy.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

4 Essays	15% each
Mid-Term Exam	10%
Final Exam	30%
Short written assignments from time to time.
