Course Description:

This course concentrates on the structures of sentences, paragraphs and essays. Written assignments offer reviews of the conventions of English grammar and the mechanics of good writing. There will be discussions and analyses of readings. Students will write a minimum of ten in-class compositions. Instruction in research will also be provided.

Objectives:

The objectives of this course are to increase the student's abilities to use appropriate means of development and support for a particular subject and audience. Students will organize sentences and paragraphs to achieve unity and coherence. Students will also be assisted in developing a writing style appropriate to the context.
