Prerequisite: 6 credits of junior English

Course Description:

This course will address some closely linked topics in literature and religion mainly in the biblical tradition. We will focus on wide variety of concepts such as self-knowledge, imagination and nature. Students will read selected biblical texts and works of literature from a different historical periods.

Texts:

The Broadview Anthology of Seventeenth-Century Verse and Prose (Broadview) John Bunyan, The Pilgrim's progress (Oxford) Bible (King James Version)

Class participation is determined by appraising the student's contribution to the ambiance of the class. The criteria I use to assess "contribution" are: a student's willingness and ability to respond and ask questions, participate in discussions either in small peer groups or with the class, give occasional oral presentations, and above all else to attend class regularly. These are not given separate grades, but I do keep an accumulative record of what individual students contribute.
