English 3380: Shakespeare

PREREQUISITE:

English 1010 or its equivalent

DESCRIPTION:

English 3380 will focus on a selection of fifteen plays by the most renowned poet in English literature. This selection includes histories, comedies, and tragedies from the early to the late periods of Shakespeare's career, although reference will be made to a number of other plays and poems in the canon. Some time will be spent exploring the political, social, cultural and historical milieu of Elizabethan England, but the principle emphasis will be on the language of the texts themselves.

The lectures and discussion will focus primarily on analysis of the texts. Other matters discussed will include the following: the renaissance, the Elizabethan theatre and acting companies, acting styles, the varieties of Shakespearean scholarship, characteristics of Elizabethan tragedy and comedy, courtly love and the Petrarchan convention, the pastoral tradition, theories of kingship, and so on.

Students are expected to attend viewing of video-taped productions of the plays, outside of class time, during the year. The last class in December and April will consist of a question and answer game based on the plays studied; teams will be selected and prizes given.

COURSE:

REQUIREMENTS:

3 essays of approximately 2000 words each (20% each),

A 1 hour mid-term quiz in December (10%). A 3 hour final examination in April (30%).

Explication, in class, of one passage selected from the plays.

Marks will be deducted for papers turned in late, and no papers will be accepted after the others are returned. Attendance is expected at all classes and it will be assumed, therefore, that students are aware of course material as well as announcements, deadlines, etc. given in class.
