#### Course Description:

This course is an examination of the literary work as a political document. In another word, we will focus on the politics of literary writing in the context of British Imperial expansion and its post-colonial aftermath. In this course, we will pay close attention to current debates about representation and resistance, identity, power, politics, race, gender and ethnicity. We will examine works from a number of genres, including films, in our discussion, and we will see how the history of colonialism, decolonization and later nationalism has shaped literary and cultural practices in countries like Ireland, Canada, Australia, India, the Caribbean, South Africa, and Nigeria.

### Course Objectives:

The objective of this course is to engage students with the historical and cultural contexts within the context of global capitalism.
