CALENDAR DESCRIPTION: This theory course includes hydraulic system fundamentals, components such as pumps, reservoirs, valves, coolers, cylinders and accumulators. Component disassembly, reassembly and testing are included in the course.

OBJECTIVES:

Upon completion of this course the student will be able to:

1. Explain hydraulic systems, principles of operation.
2. Calculate pressure, force, area, volume, flow rates, cycle times, power.
3. Interpret and draw hydraulic schematic diagrams.
4. Safely service hydraulic systems and components.
5. Explain hydraulic fluid properties and select fluid.
6. Explain functions of reservoirs, filters and heat exchangers.
7. Explain the construction and application of common hydraulic hoses.
8. Explain common pump operation.
9. Explain the operation and application of pressure relief and flow control valves, accumulators, and hydraulic actuators.

TRANSFERABILITY: None.
