## **CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:**

The course covers the political, economic, social and cultural history of the European people between 1350 and 1815. The course will trace developments from the Renaissance and Reformation periods to the Age of Absolutism, and will probe the Enlightenment and the end of the Old Regime and birth of Revolutionary Europe.

# **CREDIT/CONTACT HOURS:**

HI 2090 consists of three hours of lecture and discussion each week.

The course work includes lectures, discussions, research and writing assignments as well as a midterm and final exam.

- To give students insight into how various forces have shaped European history
- To develop and enhance historical research and synthesis skills as well as composition skills.
