Calendar Description:	This section of ID2010 will focusing on the masterpieces and common practices in the cultural history of Grande Prairie of the past 50 years. The class coincides Grande Prairie's 50 th Anniversary and with a Heritage Summer Theatre project that is being co-sponsored by the Grande Prairie Museum, the Grande Prairie Pioneer Museum Society, Muskoseepi Park, the Grande Prairie Regional Tourism Association, and GPRC Fine Arts Department.
Course Content:	Students will collaboratively research, create, and perform vignettes based on persons, events, and trends that have informed Grande Prairie's cultural history. The summer theatre project will encompass the course and surpass it. Students need to be able to commit to the project as a whole, knowing that their work in the project will give them course credit. Students will develop research skills, facilitation skills, performance skills, and become knowledgeable interpreters of Grande Prairie's cultural history.
Evaluation:	Class participation (including research & creation) 40%, written assignments 20%, performances 40%.
Timeline:	45 hours over 10 weeks, June 2 through August 8.
Required Materials:	Research materials will be provided through community sources such as the South Peace Regional Archives and the Public Library, as well as by individual witnesses.
Additional Costs:	n/a
